CERTIFICATE
No. *1683*

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, *Calla Hardy, of Roseau County, Minnesota*

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at *Crookston, Minnesota*, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said *Calla Hardy*

according to the provisions of

the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," and the acts supplemental thereto, for

The Lot numbered Three, the East-half of the South West quarter and the South West-quarter of the South East quarter of Section eighteen in Township one hundred and sixty-two North of Range thirty-four West of the Fifth Principal Meridian in Minnesota, containing one hundred and sixty-two acres and fourteen hundredths of an acre

according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said *Calla Hardy*

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said *Calla Hardy*

and to *her* heirs, the said tract above described: To HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said *Calla Hardy* and to *her* heirs and assigns forever.
