PIERRE PARMENTIER, (ca. 1630-1701), of Belgium, Germany and New York; his wife Antoinette (Terrin), and their only son, MICHAEL², (1653/4 to after 1724). Male lines of descent to approximately 1800.

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FOREWORD:

This typescript will be more effective when used in conjunction with comparable works by the compiler:

We suggest consulting published genealogies of affiliated families, when available; the two most helpful would be:

The principal source for this work has been the early Dutch Church records in the Vosburgh Collection of register transcriptions. For those not acquainted with this phase of research, --- the Dutch records are exceedingly valuable for the details entered by various dominies. Baptismal records generally specified the full names of both parents, and the sponsors (or god-parents) were usually closely related to the child, -- here again, the maiden name of the lady was often given, (although in some instances she might not have been the wife of the co-sponsor). In this work, many of the sponsors are not named, (but can be found in the original transcripts).

This typescript will be photo-copied in late ~~April~~, 1976, and the sets made available to key Libraries best serving the Public. Predictably, the New York Genealogical & Biographical Society will receive the first copy. Adriance Memorial Library in Poughkeepsie, Conn. State Library in Hartford and the Congressional Library will also have copies. Permission to reproduce the material may be obtained from the compiler.

The branches from PETER³ (by two marriages) are better defined than those from his younger brothers, MICHAEL³ Jr. and DAMEN³ on the following page (b). As explained in the text following the Charts, it seems reasonable to believe that the PETER who married a 37-yr-old widow in 1755 would have to be PETER⁴ Jr.

To generalize: the 4th generation remained in the Poughkeepsie area. PETER⁵ and his brothers Francis, John and Henry moved to the Germantown/Livingston area; FRANCIS⁵ remained, but the other three went on to Watervliet; ISAAC H.⁵ stayed in P. JOHN⁵ and HENRY⁵ were of Loyalist sympathies, --- FRANCIS an active Colonial, as were (perhaps) PETER⁵ and ISAAC H.⁵. Some of the cousins remained neutral, uneasily.

Infinite patterns of inter-marriage are revealed (in part) by our typescripts of the early LeROY, Van de BOGART and Van KLEECK Families, --- and by the FRKER and VIELÉ genealogies; there are also items in the N.Y. Gen. & Biog. Record.

These two charts constitute an earnest effort to align the elusive PAIMETTER families in a reasonable semblance of order. ERRORS are inevitable, and further research is advised. Some of the units (and individuals) are actually "interchangeable". CAUTION.

Mr. Howard A. McConville, 1354 DeWitt St., Schenectady NY 12303, is and has long been the authority on the family. He has been most gracious and cooperative in sharing his findings. Without his help, there would have been many more mistakes.

The original name of PARMENTIER subsequently became (generally) PALMATIER, but has been found in other forms, ---- "Polmonteer", "Pamateer" and even "Permeton", with variants. Some PARMENTIERs came into New York from Massachusetts, to add to the confusions. These papers will use what seem the prevailing spellings.

The best references for the earliest PARMENTIERs will be found in Bergen's "Early Settlers of King's County", (p. 221); Holland Society Year Book (1897), pp. 133 & 194; P. H. Smith's "History of Dutchess County", (p. 100); Riker's History of Harlem (N.Y.), (p. 447), and volume 47 of New York Genealogical & Biographical Record, (NYGBR, hereafter), --- with many other helpful items, (but not thoroughly gleaned by us after 1945). The 1968 FREER Genealogy and the VIELÉ Genealogy contain many references to PALMATIERs and to allied families. We suggest using these papers in conjunction with our recent LeROY, Van de BOGART and Van KLEBECK typescript, --- there were many inter-marriages.

In 1974 we were fortunate in re-establishing correspondence with Mr. Howard A. McConville of Schenectady, N.Y., ---- after a lapse of 35 years. As a result of a stimulating exchange of letters, it seemed desirable to revise the typescript then (1974) in process, --- and the frequent use of "H.M." will indicate often (but not to full extent) the value of his cooperations.

First Generation

PIERRE¹ PARMENTIER, born (say ca. 1630?), came with his wife Antoinette (Terrin) and their nine-year-old son Michael to Nieu Amsterdam (now New York City) in 1663, on the ship "Spotted Cow". Apparently they had originated in the city of Coutraï, Belgium, and as Huguenots had been driven by the Spanish invaders to Mannheim, Germany.

They settled at Bedford, Long Island, (part of present-day Brooklyn), and conducted a grist-mill there. In 1670 the father was a trustee of the town, and in 1671 an overseer of Brooklyn. After a brief interlude at Harlem, the family moved to Kingston, Ulster County, where he died in 1701.

The only known child of this couple was MICHAEL².

MICHAEL² PARMENTIER, born about 1653/4, married Neeltje/Cornelia Damen about 1679; she was the daughter of Jan Cornelisz and Sophia (Martense) Damen, * and her father's uncle, Jan Damen, owned the Wall Street section of lower Manhattan, --- in the 20th Century the most valuable real estate in the world. MICHAEL adapted well to the heterogeneous culture of the metropolis peopled by Dutch, French and English immigrants; while still in his twenties he was a magistrate at Brooklyn in 1679 (and again in 1691), --- serving also as a Lieutenant in the Foot Guard.

He and his wife sold their mill at Bushwick in 1695, and their home there in 1699, (NYGBR-54), joining his father at Kingston; not long thereafter they settled at Poughkeepsie. The 1714 Census shows their household as composed of one male over 60, two males 16 or over and one under 16; one female between 16 and 60, ^{two} ~~two~~ under 16, and two slaves. Since Peter³ then had his own domicile, the two ~~males~~ ^{males} were presumably Jan and Michael Jr., with Damen³, the youngest, under 16.

The parents were alive as late as 1724; their death-dates do not appear. Their nine children are detailed on the next page.

PETER³ PARMENTIER, eldest son of MICHAEL² and Neeltje (Damen) PARMENTIER, was bp. June 13, 1680 at New Utrecht, L.I., ("born June 6 at Bushwick"). He mar. (1) Oct. 18 1702, (Kingston rec.), Sara Van Kleeck, dau. of Hon. Baltus B. and Tryntje (Buys) Van Kleeck, born supp. ab. 1682. She died in 1713/4 and he mar. (2), banns at Kingston Nov. 21 1714, Helena Van de Bogart, dau. of Myndert H.² and Helena (Schermerhorn) Van de Bogart, and born prob. ab. 1694/5. Death dates for PETER and for his second wife have not been found, and cannot be approximated.

It seems likely that the family unit was settled at Poughkeepsie about 1705, but since the Church there was not formed until 1716/7, they were served by missionary ministers from Kingston and from New York. The 1714 Census of Poughkeepsie shows a household composed of one male 16-60 and two under 16, one female 16-60 and three under 16; presumably the first wife was still alive in early 1714.

The first marriage (to Sara Van Kleeck) produced probably ~~six~~ children, six of them appearing in the Kingston Church records, --- although the baptismal rites probably were performed in Poughkeepsie.

Neeltje, (she? or cousin?), was sponsor (with Johannes Swarthout) for 1740 child of MICHAEL³ & Maria (Tietsoort). CAUTION; uncertain "identification".

9. PETER⁴, Jr., bp. (Oct. 6 1718, New Utrecht rec., acc. H.M.); almost certainly the one who mar. twice-widowed Catharina (Van de Bogart) (LeRoy) Van Kleeck. The VIELE Genealogy probably erred in giving Peter a wife "Sara Freer", --- not acknowledged in the FREER Gen.

10. JACOBUS⁴, bp. Poughkeepsie Feb. 4 1720, mar. Aariantje ~~LeRoy~~.

11. JOHANNES/JOHN⁴, bp. Poughk. Jan. 3 1722, mar. Blandina LeRoy.

NOTE: At this point in the study of the family, correspondence with Mr. Howard A. McConville of Schenectady, N.Y., --- started in 1939, --- was resumed (in 1974). So many additions, corrections and revisions evolved from the stimulating exchange that it seemed advisable to re-type the script now superceded. He, ("H.M.", hereafter), and the writer, ("P.G."), had friendly differences of opinion about some of the items, but each sought the FACTS. When there are conflicting theories, each will be presented, in the hope that concerned searchers will probe record-sources not available in Schenectady or in Florida, (but perhaps in the Wills, Deeds etc. of Dutchess County).

MICHAEL³ PARMENTIER, Jr., second surviving son of MICHAEL² and Neeltje (Damen) Parmentier, was bp. at New Utrecht, L. I., in 1687. He mar. Oct. 2 1717, (Kingston rec.), Marytje/Maria Tietsoort, bp. May 7 1699, youngest dau. of Wm. A. and Neeltje (Swart) Tietsoort and sister of Helena, who had mar. his bro. DAMEN³.

They may have been living as late as 1767, when "Michel Parmentier and wife" were sponsors for Maria and Michael DEYO, chn. of Christian and Elizabeth (Parmentier) Deyo, at Poughkeepsie, --- (but Michael⁴ 3rd and w. Maria (Oakley) might have been the god-parents).

It should be noted that the children of this unit and of the following, (DAMEN³), were cousins-germane, sharing the same grandparents. Name-repetitions lead to confusions, but we submit a reasonable listing of the children:

DAMEN³ PARMENTIER, youngest son of MICHAEL² and Neeltje (Damen), bp. New Utrecht Jan. 21 1694, mar. by 1717 Helena Tietsoort, bp. Kingston June 7 1695, dau. of Wm. Abr. & Neeltje (Swart) Tietsoort and sister of Maria, later w. of his bro. MICHAEL³ Jr., above. Both were prob. alive as late as 1766, as sponsors for a child of ~~KLICKER~~ their son JACOB⁴.

Despite gaps in the Poughkeepsie Dutch Church records, the following list of their children seems valid:

From about 1725 to 1738 and from 1745 to 1764 there are gaps in the records of the Reformed Church at Poughkeepsie. Lutheran, Dutch Reformed and some Episcopal ministers from New York City and smaller communities became the spiritual circuit-riders of their time, and some of their casual records have been published in NYGB Record; some of the surrounding ~~town~~ parishes, too, provided baptismal and other services for Poughkeepsie families. Generally, however, it has been difficult to document Palmatier (and other) groups with children born during these periods in Poughkeepsie.

At about the middle of the 18th century, the name-spelling became more often "Palmatier" rather than "Parmentier", --- but with some in Poughkeepsie area favoring "Polmontier"; even "Paltherton" and variants have been noted in up-state Saratoga County, and "Permaton" (however far-fetched) is possible.

Fourth Generation

PETER⁴ PALMATIER, (Peter³, Michael²), son* of Peter Parmentier by his second wife, Helena (Van de Bogart), was bp. Oct. 6 1718, (New Utrecht Chh. rec., acc. to H.M.; P.G. had thought him older, and by 1st w. --- erring). As Peter "Jr.", he and his sister Sara were sponsors for a child of their half-sister Tryntje, in 1740. Apparently he was a bachelor until he mar. twice-widowed Catharina (Van de Bogart) (LeRoy) Van Kleeck, by license issued Oct. 15 1755. She had been bp. Poughkeepsie June 1 1718, dau. of Jacobus³ and Margaret (DuMont) V.D.B.; to her first husband, Frans³ LeROY Jr. she had borne a dau. Frances in 1738, and to her second, two chn. (Myndert and Alida), the youngest of Hon. Johannes Van Kleeck's brood. By the third marriage she had only one recorded child:

1. Jacobus⁵, born Aug. 4 1758 and baptized at New Hackensack, with his maternal grandparents as sponsors. There is no further record of him, --- but a probe of Count land records might indicate the disposition of inher. land. In 1764, PETER and Cath. (V.d.B.) Palmatier received property from the estate of her deceased father, admin. by her bro.s Jacobus and Myndert.

NOTE: Mr. McConville was of the opinion that the sire of 1758 Jacobus was a Peter born "ab. 1739, pr. s. of Peter and Sara (Freer)", -- and H.M. adds two "prob." sisters of Jacobus, (Helena, b. ab. 1767, and Cath., b. ab. 1768).

REBUTTAL (by P.G.): Catharina, the mother, is established as having been bp. 1718, and we cannot accept a 16-year-old as her 3rd mate, nor the likelihood of her having borne two children ~~when nearly~~ ^{when nearly} fifty.
"Sara (Freer)" as wife of any Peter Palmatier is not acknowledged in the 1968 FREER Gen. We should attribute this error to the VIELE Gen., (q.v.).

Tracing the land involved in the 1764 conveyance (above) should reveal whether or not there were any surviving deac. of this PALMATIER alliance; if not, the property would have reverted to Frances (w. of Isaac) FITCHETT, to Myndert Van KLEECK and to Alida (w. Lewis) DuBOIS.

* In 1976 revision, PETER⁴ Jr is now shown as 2nd surviving son

MICHAEL⁴ PALMATIER, ^{eldest surv.} ~~youngest~~ son of Peter³ (Michael²) and Sara (Van Kleeck), bp. May 6 1711, (Kingston rec.), mar. by 1738 Aariantje Hegeman, prob. dau. of Frans HEGEMAN. He died by 1773 and his widow mar. (2) at Poughkeepsie Feb. 8, 1774, Cornelis VIELE, widower of Rachel (Swarthout) and son of Peter and Johanna (Van de Bogart) Vielé. The VIELE Gen. errs in the parentage of this MICHAEL⁴, and makes a mis-leading assumption as to the wife of Peter⁵.

In 1963 Mr. McConville received a copy of the family record from Mrs. Paul A. Dorathy of Fruitland, Idaho. This proved invaluable in putting the family in true perspective, (although -- curiously -- the first three children were not included, yet belonged). The family originated in Poughkeepsie.

 Census as "John Palmatier 1st", (3-1-2), next to the household of Wm. Emmott,
 (his son-in-law); "John 2nd" would have been his nephew, son of JACOBUS⁴, ante.

He died intestate by Feb. 9 1793, when administration of his estate was
 granted to his son-in-law, Wm. EMMOT; the papers referred to the widow and to
 the "only son, Peter". One might infer that there were only two children sur-
 viving, --- but H.M. adds two more daughters, and apparently with validity.

MICHAEL⁴ PALMATIER (3rd), eldest son of Michael³ Jr. & Maria (Tietsoort) P.,

 found only the eldest and the youngest, --- the rest were supplied by Mr. McCon-
 ville. Some of them seem to have moved to New Paltz, there to compete (for ident-
 ifications) with other groups; (see DALEEN⁴, p. 8; JOHN⁴, p. 9; PETER⁴, p. 10).

WILLIAM⁴ PALMATIER, son of Michael³ and Maria (Tietsoort) P., bp. June 7 1721 at Poughkeepsie, was prob. the one who mar. ab. 1743 Rebecca Ellsworth, born June 6 1727, dau. of Dr. Josias and Margaret (-----) Ellsworth from Conn. In 1765 they were sponsors for William, son of Damer & Catrina (Wood) Palmatier, at P. Only two children were recorded, but there were surely others; H.M. and P.G. suggest the following as part of their family:

1. Maria/Marytje, b. Jan. 20 1744, bp. "at Chatham", (NYC Lutheran rec., NYGER-97), her sponsors being Michael & Maria Palmatier, (pr. her uncle and wife, whose dau. Antje was bp. the same day). She mar. by 1765 Damer BARTLEY, son of her father's cousin-Germane, Elizabeth (P.).
2. Joseph, b. Oct. 1 1746 and bp. "at Peter Lossing's", (NYC Lutheran rec.), with Joseph Ellsworth and Jannetje, w. of Sam'l Ellsworth, as sponsors. He and Phebe Ellsworth, (later w. of Michael Van Kleeck-LeRoy), were sp. in 1765 for his sister's son Wm. He "died in the War", (H. M.).
3. DAMER⁵, "b. ab. 1747", (H. M.), and mar. "ab. 1765 at Rhinebeck" Catrina Wood, --- a very young bridegroom, but the identification seems correct.
4. JOSIA/JOSUA/JOSHUA⁵, (b. say ca. 1750), seems almost cert. of this family, named after maternal gr. father. VIELE Gen. reports mar. of "Josua" to Jannetje Vielé; "Joshua & Jane PALMERTON" conveyed in Saratoga Co., 1801.
5. THOMAS, b. say ca. 175-, (added by Mr. McConville, with no details), appears in P.G.'s files only for Rev. War service, --- as "Thomas Palmerton". No record of marriage or family. William "Palmatier" and John "Palmetier" were in the same regiment of "Pawling's Levies".
6. JOHN⁵, called "PALMERTON" in D.A.R. Patriots' Index, "b. 1756, d. 7/3/1824; m. Eliz. Wilsey"; he seems to fit this picture. Perhaps there were other chn., --- poss. including a Wm. Jr. It will be noted that this group favored the PALMERTON rendition of the name.

DAMEN⁴ PALMATIER, son of Michael³ Jr and Maria (Tietsoort) P., was bapt. Nov. 22 1722 at Poughkeepsie, and mar. by 1763 Antje Oakley. Mr. McConville suggests that she was "bp. 1726 at P., d/o Jonathan Oakley & Antje Schouten", (but P.G. differs as to her age; she might have been several years younger --- if mother of a son born "ab. 1783"); OAKLEY family records should be probed. Possibilities of Confusion abound, --- starting with his double-cousin, DAMEN⁴ Jr, in Poughkeepsie records. The 1790 Census reported a Damen P. at New Paltz, Ulster Co., (2-2-5); a Damen "Sr", (1-1-4), and a Damen "Jr", (1-6-2), --- both in Poughkeepsie, and not necessarily father and son. Land records of New Paltz might provide definite information. (See also ADDENDA, post). Four children were recorded in P. Dutch Church, --- H.M. adding three more as "probable"; P.G. appends SPECULATIONS (and comments). Tentatively:

1. Celetje "(prob.)", "b. ab. 1763"; (P.G. suggests that she may have mar. John BARRETT by 1781, with chn. with Daniel, Polly, Elizabeth, Susanna, Sara and Abram BARRETT rec. at New Paltz 1781-99. H.M. calls her the wife of Simeon J. FREER, --- but see pp. 6 & 16).
 2. MICHAEL⁵, bp. P. Nov. 17 1765, with Michael Palmatier and Sara Palmatier as sponsors; mar. Geertje/"Charity" Hegeman at Fonda, NY, and died at Hegeman, NY, Sept. 2 1842, ae. "77".

SPECULATIONS about DAMEN⁴ 2nd & Antje (Oakley) P. and their family, (from prev. p.)

There may have been other (unrecorded) chn. of this couple, --- perhaps in the New Paltz area; but it was in this town that other PALMATIERs settled, notably his ^{supposed} brother JOHN⁴. These other families should be studied carefully in relation to one another, for the published New Paltz records do not account for all of them.

"John Dornan Palmateer" is listed as a Rev. War pensioner from N. Y., --- File # 7889. One suspects that the middle name was properly "Damen", indicative of his father's name; if so, he would have been the eldest son, born in the early 1760s, and a young recruit. Examination of his claim papers might be important.

A Jonathan Parmeter (or variant spelling) was in the 1790 Census at Stephentown, Rensselaer Co., (1-2-4), --- and may have been from the non-related PARMENTER family of central Mass. If not, one should consider the fact that Antje (Oakley) Palmatier's father was named Jonathan.

JOHN⁴ PALMATIER, (unrecorded), was probably a son of Michael³ Jr. and Maria (Tietsoort) P., and was so placed in the typecript by Mr. McConville, as "born ab. 1741"; (P.G. suggests that ~~either~~ he was older, and born either ca. 1732/3 or 1737/8, -- better suiting the patterns). According to H. M., he mar. "about 1761 at Lloyd (New Paltz) "Annie Aiken, bp. 14 Sept. 1743 at Poughkeepsie, d/o John Aiken and Margaret Hicks". This locates the family in New Paltz.

The Biographical Record of Ulster County states that JOHN had owned a farm --- presumably at New Paltz --- where the family had "relocated after the burning of Kingston" (during the Revolution); this reference specified him as the father of Peter (below). Again, --- Ulster Co. Deeds should be proved.

Tentatively, he would seem to have been the JOHN listed in the 1790 Census at New Paltz, (1-1-3), --- next to John BARRETT (who had mar. Geletje PALMATIER), and separated by only three PRESIAR households from Michael PALMATIER, (the one who had mar. Hannah PRESIAR?); and Mich⁴, in turn, was only two families from William LITZ, (who had mar. Eliz. PALMATIER, d/o Michael⁴ 3rd). (Just what significance was there? We don't know, and it's still confusing). At New Paltz, one should remember, the family of Michael⁴ (3rd) seem to have been involved as well, (see page 7).

Mr. McConville names seven children, with approximated dates, --- and P.G. adds comments, speculations and questions, (without knowledge of sources).

Rec. abv., adding that their chn. were John, Isaac, Hannah, Abram, Esther, Mary, GILBERT⁶ (b. 1812), Lewis and Eliza. The parents were bur. in Lloyd's cemetery, formerly New Paltz.
6. "Lewis", b. ab. 1768". (P.G. notes a "Lewis Pontler" in N. P. 1790, 1-1-2).
7. "prob. Sally, b. ab. 1782, and mar.", (H.M.).

Family tradition states that PETER⁵ had a bro. ABRAHAM and "several sisters", --- and perhaps another bro., Damen. On that basis, P.G. suggests possible additions:

- A. Might Annie's maiden name have been properly Van Aiken, not "Aiken"?
- B. Was the suggested ABRAHAM perhaps too old to have been her son?
- C. Would the one-year spacing of birth-years for 5 chs. be unrealistic?
- D. Might Celetje, w. of John BARRETT by 1781, have belonged to this group?
Their chs., Dan'l, Polly, Eliz., Sus., Sara & Abram were b. New Paltz.
H. M. thought her a dau. of Peter⁴ & Rebecca, but see postea.

All surmises should be carefully studied, and in relation to competing families.

MICHAEL⁴ PALMATIER, eldest son of Damen³ (Michael²) & Helena (Tietsoort), bp. Poughkeepsie May 6 1724, prob. m. Lydia Kuykendal by 1750; the only record pertaining to this couple comes from the registers of the Mackackeneck Reformed Church of "Deer Park", NY, (NYGR-42); this was near Port Jervis and the State line where Penn. and N. J. join N. Y. Their only known child:

They prob. lived in the Fishkill/New Hackensack area; study of land records might add to the limited ~~records~~ ^{data}. Only one child is rec., H.M. and P.G. suggest a partial listing of this unit:

PETER⁴ PALMATIER, 3rd son of Damen³ & Helena (Tietsoort) P., b. Pou. Feb. 8 1730 and bp. in May, (NYC Lutheran, NYGR-97), there mar. Nov. 23 1754, Rebecca "Tankens"/Tompkins, "b. Pals" (New Paltz). They may have settled there, but he is not listed in the 1790 Census. Until recently, the writer had thought this couple the parents of several chn., but H.M. said there was only one (Celetje).

In April 1966 H.M. wrote that PETER left a will (of which P.G. had not been aware), mentioning no chn. There are instances in which a testator had already provided for his progeny; this might have been the case, but we don't know.

(2) Jan. 15 1783 at Pou., Abigail Kinnion (or Kenyon?). He was on the 1771 tax list as "Jacob D.", and in 1790 headed a household of 5 males under 16, 5 females and himself. He died at Poughkeepsie Nov. 22 1819, aged "ab. 85" (obit.), leaving an 1816 will which named his w. Abig. exec'r and bequeathed to sons Michael, Samuel, Milford & Jacob; dau.s Maria, Nelly, Martha, Eliz., Abigail & Sally, (in that order. Unfortunately, he did not give his daughters' married names).

Because of the gap in P. Church records, we interject some assumptions, --- placing Michael⁵ in the first group, etc. By wife Maria (Pels), pr. 6 chn.:

JACOB⁴ bought fractional shares of property in New Paltz in 1791, from Robert LeROY, (hus. of Blandina Palmatier). This seems to have been FREER land orig., and inherited by Robert et al. Other deeds should be checked in Ulster Co.

ISAAC⁴ PALMATIER, prob. son of Damen³ & Helena (Tietsoort), P., ---'tho' H.M. thinks him s. of Michael³ Jr, was born (say ab. 1736/7), served in the Militia in 1760, and by 1767 mar. Helena/Lena Van de Bogart, perh. d/o Myndert F.⁴ & Tryntje (Rhynders), -- mar. in 1746. The family were at Ballston NY in the 1790 Census, (1-1-4), and later settled at Schenectady, (acc. H.M.).

To the four dau.s bp. at Pou., H.M. adds ~~five~~^{five} more, with some data; there are minor conflicts, but the following list seems reasonable:

The family may have been there (in Pou.) in 1790, (see Addenda, p. 16), but settled at Schenectady, acc. H.M.

Again, we stress the importance of (re)evaluating the relationships in the groups associated with the New Paltz area particularly. Uncertainties and possible conflicts remain, --- perhaps to be resolved by on-the-spot RESEARCH, and by study of affiliated families.

With conclusion of the Fourth Generation families, we proceed to the Fifth. With so many more units to be defined, the material will be more tightly condensed, and some of the attempted identifications will be more difficult.

Some of the sons appearing in the pages preceding will not be noted in the following, unless additional material warrants amplification or comments.

In the Lloyds cemetery (formerly in New Paltz) lie buried Abraham Palmatier, (d. Jan. 19, 1840, ae. 81), and Peter Palmatier, (1766-1849), --- and a desc. of Peter referred to them as brothers. On pp. 8-9, we submitted a tentative family for DAMEN⁴ (Michael³²) and his wife Antje (Oakley) P., with possible New Paltz associations; these speculations included the Abraham interred at New Paltz/Lloyds, and should be borne in mind. Research in the Ulster Co. land records might provide a solution; at this time, we must consider the matter "sub judice".

If there were two Abrahams, and if their respective fathers were Michael⁴ and his brother Damen⁴, the wives (and mothers) would have been Maria Oakley and Antje Oakley ---- perhaps sisters? This has interesting facets.

ABRAHAM⁵ PAIMATIER (bp. '56 or b. ab. '58) (of whatever parentage) and his wife Elizabeth (Lane) were mar. about 1776, according to Mr. McConville, supplying data of eight chn.:

DAMEN⁵ PAIMATIER, sup. son of William⁴ and Rebecca (Ellsworth) P., born "about 1747 at Poughkeepsie", (acc. H.M.), "mar. ab. 1765 at Rhinebeck NY Catrina Wood, dau. of John Wood and Lena Decker." P.G. finds one son and H.M. adds another. There was a Damen at New Paltz in 1790 Census, (2-2-5), and in Poughkeepsie there were Damen "Sr.", (1-3-4), and Damen "Jr.", (1-0-2), --- not necessarily father and son, but perhaps so termed in context of seniority.

1. William, bp. P. Sept. 22 1765.
2. John, "b. Feb. 19 1767", (H.M.). bp Wartenburg Luth. Ch'h, (near Rhinebeck).

JOSIA or JOSHUA⁵ "PALMERTON", almost cert. son of William⁴ (Michael³²) and Rebecca (Ellsworth) P., ~~ex~~ born (say ca. 1750), mar. by 1771 Jannetje/Jane Vielé, dau. of Myndert, (see V. Gen.). They were in Saratoga Co., NY, by 1801, when "Joshua and Jane Palmerton" deeded land to Barent P. Palmerton. From scant rec.s:

MICHAEL⁵ "PALMATEER", son of Damen⁴ (Michael³²), by w. Antje (Oakley), bp. Pou. Nov. 17 1765, seems surely the one who mar. Geertje/"Charity" Hegeman ~~ix~~ May 18 1793 at Ponda NY, (Dutch Ch.). They may have lived at Amsterdam also. He died at

MICHAEL⁵ (Damen⁴ Michael³²) & Gerritje/Charity (Hegeman) P., (continued):

at Hegeman, Montgomery Co. NY Sept. 2 1842, ac. 77; wid. "Charity" d. Jan. 22 1849, in her 77th yr., (NYGBR-62). They had at least a son:

JOSEPH⁵ PALMATIER, (Wm.⁴ Damen³ Michael²) was bp. Oct. 7 1753, acc. to Mr. McConville. The Compendium of American Genealogy (Virkus) states that he was of Dutchess and Schoharie Counties, mar. Sarah Van Dusen in 1779 and died in 1824. Two daughters are named:

2. Magdalena, b. 1783, (m. Ezer NETHAWAY in 1803, acc. U.A.G.).

SUMMARY:

In collecting records of this family, the writer made no attempt to follow them after 1800. Due to family responsibilities etc., the many notes were laid aside in 1945 and were not collated until 1974, --- and during this period no further research was undertaken; quite conceivably many other items might have appeared in the interim. This work has been done in Florida, -- far from the genealogical libraries and from the sources of original-research material, --- and the limitations have been legion.

Adriance Memorial Library in Poughkeepsie, (an excellent base for Dutchess County research), will have carbon copies of this typescript, together with typescripts of the LeROY, Van de Bogart and Van Kleeck families, --- all closely linked with the Palmatier-Parmentier progeny of early generations.

Mr. Howard A. McConville, (1354 De Witt Street, Schenectady NY 12303), is THE Authority on the family. Now retired from the Schenectady Historical Society, he has compiled (in typescript form) a documentation covering several hundred descendants, and well into the 20th century. He has been most cooperative in answering the many questions written to him, and "P.G." is most grateful to "H.M."

GILBERT "PALMANTIER" lies buried in the Burdett cem. in Trumansburg NY, the g.s.i. specifying that he was b. July 28 1771 and died May 23 1852; the next stone, "fallen on its face", might have been that of his wife. Also interred there were "Lucina KING, wife of Alos and dau. of Gilbert and Mrs PALMANTIER, d. July 19 1837, ac. 32-10-24", --- also David PALMANTIER, died Sept. 19, 1845, ac. 27-1-29. From these data we may infer that there was at least one son, (father of David), in addition to the above daughter.

GILBERT would seem to have been the son included by Mr. McConville in the family of JOHN⁴ & Annie (Aiken), and younger than the "ab. 1765" approximation of Mr. H. See page 9, ante.

(Additions, Corrections, Unidentified and Misc.)

In the preparation of the pages preceding, numerous items seemed to need further notes; even in the course of indexing, some new conflicts and speculations appeared. Also, it seemed desirable to include Census and Pensions references. Lumped together, the sundry categories appear in more-or-less alphabetical order, and include such UNIDENTIFIED persons as are shown in our files.

- AARIANTJE/ARIANTJE (in early records) was later often rendered as "ADRIANA" or "ADRIAN"; the English version is sometimes "Harriet".
- ABRAHAM presents the possibility of two of the name, --- one bp. 1756 and the other b. 1758/9 (g.s.i. calc.), of New Paltz. See pp. 7, 8, and 14.
- ADRIAN/-A, see AARIANTJE, above.
- ANTJE, bp. 1744, now seems eldest d/o Michael⁴ (3rd), not youngest of Michael³ Jr., -- therefore belonging on page 3, not page 4.
- ARIANTJE, page 12, wife of Hugo A. Van Kleeck by 1783, is considered (by H.M.) the d/o Peter⁵ & Sara (Swarthout), and b. ab. 1766. P.G. has mis-givings; she was a 3rd wife, and if only 17 pretty young to have been step-mother to two older than herself. Except for fam. rec. (p. 6), she'd seem d/o Michael⁴ and Ariantje (Hegeman). Some rec.s call her "Adriana".
- ARIANTJE Palmatier was co-sponsor (with Henricus BARTLEY) for Henricus, bp. P. Aug. 14 1774, s. of Damen⁴ and Elizabeth (Bartley) PALMATIER. There is no indication that she was then mar.; wid. Ariantje (Hegeman) P. had re-married 6 months previously, would not have been so recorded.
- CATHERINE / Tryntje mar. Jacobus VIELÉ, step-son of Ariantje (Hegeman)(Palmatier) Vielé, by 1787, and died at New Paltz Jan. 22 1840, aged 72, (ergo b. ab. '68/9). The VIELÉ Gen. erred as to her mother, --- (supp. "Sara Freer", impossible), but a "Peter" might have been her father; this Gen. gives chn.: Rachel, Petrus, Sara, Cornelis, Ariantje, Myndert; Hannah, Anna, Maria and Jane, --- names seemingly most significant. At first, she appeared to belong in the family of Peter⁵ & Sara (Swarthout), page 12, but H.M. found a Sara bp. 1768; for want of a better alternative, she was tentatively suggested for the family of Peter⁴ and Rebecca (Tompkins), page 10. (This is still not satisfactory). *

- CELETJE has several variants: Celia, Seltje, Sally and "Sisley".
- CELETJE / "Sisley", b. 1762 d/o Michael⁴ (p. 6), almost cert. m. Simeon J. FREER.
- CELETJE, b. (say ab. 1760-2), m. John BARRETT by 1781; chn. rec. New Paltz. P. 10.
- CORNELIA was the anglicized version of "NEELTJE".
- DAMEN appeared often in the records; in three instances it was rendered "Thomas".
- DAMEN³, bp. 1694, mar. Helena Tietsoort by 1717.
- DAMEN⁴, bp. 1722, s. Michael³ Jr., pr. m. Antje Oakley.
- DAMEN⁴, bp. 1739, s. Damen³, pr. m. Elizabeth Bartley.

- ELIZABETH, b. 1768 d/o Michael⁴ 3rd, (p. 7), & hus. Wm. LITZ had 2 chn. bp. N.P.
- "GARRET" Palmatier and Eliz. Palmatier were sponsors for Maria, d/o Jacobus⁴, 1775 at Poughkeepsie. No such name appears elsewhere in our files/

HANNAH, sometimes rendered as JOHANNA or as ANNETJE.
HELENA/LENA/"Lientje", occasionally appearing as "Eleanor" or "Elinor", or "Neeltje"
HELENA, ("NEELTJE" in 1st mar.), m. (1) at Fishkill 1742 Robert HUSTED; (2) at Pou.

SARA/SARAH are inter-changeable. "SALLY" generally was SARA, but sometimes CELETJE. SARA, (b. say ca. 1756-8), d/o JACOBUS⁴ (p. 6), pr. m. Daniel SMITH, 1780 at New Hachensack, but P.G. believes she mar. (2), also at New Hack., Matthew BUYS, Nov. 26 1786; (their dau. Eliz. was bp. P. Jan. 7 1787). Her father's will did not specify her married name. SARA is named by H.M. as 3rd d/o PETER⁵, (p. 12), and "bp. July 19 1769; m. Matheus BUYS". P. G. did not find that bp. rec., and notes poss. confusion as to the marriage to "Matheus BUYS". Note the preceding SARA. THOMAS "PALMERTON" served in the Rev. See page 8, prob. applicable. "TRYNTJE" was the early Dutch name, later anglicized to CATHERINE. WILLIAM appears in Index of Pensioners, (File # W 26290), with wid. Mary Ann; p.10. WILLIAM listed at Fishkill, 1790 Cs., (1-0-2); perhaps the preceding. See p. 10. WILLIAM "PALMATUS" was listed at Kinderhook, 1790, (1-0-2).
