I *David Enos* of the *Town* of *Greenbush* in the county of *Rensselaer* in the state of New-York, Do, according to the act of the Congress of the United States of America, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the revolutionary war," make the following DECLARATION under oath, that is to say: I do solemnly declare, that I am a resident citizen of the United States, to wit, in the town, county and state aforesaid, and that by reason of my reduced circumstances in life, I am in need of assistance from my country for support. I do further declare, that I was a *private soldier* in the *War of the Revolution*, and that I served as such in the said war of the revolution, against the common enemy, ~~with the end of the said war,~~ *for the term of three years during said war on the continental establishment*

That I belonged to the company commanded by *Capt Champion* in *Col. Willis's* regiment, and in the line of *Connecticut*. And I do further declare, that I entered the said service the *in May* day of *one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven* and left the said service on the *day of in May* one thousand seven hundred and *eighty* having left the same by reason of *an honorable discharge which discharge I have casually lost*

And I do further declare, that I hereby relinquish all claim to every and any Pension heretofore allowed me by the laws of the United States, or of any individual state. Witness my hand, this *third* day of *April* in the year one thousand eight hundred and *eighteen*.

COUNTY OF ALBANY,

BE IT REMEMBERED, That on the *third* day of *April* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *eighteen* at the city of Albany, in the county of Albany, and state of New-York, before me *Estes Hovey* Esquire, one of the Judges of the Court of *Common Pleas* in and for the County of *Albany* in the said state, duly appointed, qualified and sworn, (the same Court being one of the Courts of Record of the said state) personally came and appeared, the before named applicant *David Enos* who resides in the town, county, and state mentioned in the above declaration, and in my presence subscribed the foregoing Declaration; and also before me then and there he was duly sworn to the truth of the facts contained and set forth in the said declaration. And it appearing to my satisfaction, as well from the said declaration under oath, as from such other evidence as was in the power of the said applicant to produce, that the said applicant served in the Revolutionary War as aforesaid, against the common enemy, and that the declaration aforesaid under oath of the said applicant is in all other respects true, I do therefore certify and transmit the testimony in the case, and the proceedings had thereon, to the Honorable the Secretary of the Department of War according to the requisitions of the act of Congress in that case made. On this 28<sup>th</sup> day of June 1890

personally appeared before the County court for said county of *Windsor* in open court, (said court being a court of record, agreeably to the laws of this state, having the power of fine and imprisonment, &c.) *David Evans* aged 59 years, resident in

*Meddleton*, in said county of *Windsor* who being first duly sworn, according to law, doth,

on his oath declare, that he served in the revolutionary war, as follows; in *Capt. Chapman's Co. Col. Miller's Regt. of Connecticut* three years from May 1777 to May 1780 - also one year in the same Co. the year before

that he made his original declaration on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of *April* 1885 has received a Pension Certificate, No. 1762. And I do solemnly swear, that I was a resident citizen

of the United States on the 18th day of March, 1818; and that I have not, since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March, 1818; - and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed: *1 pocket book \$10 - 1 box of Cheekins & 1 axe. I have also one about twenty one dollars & one about ten seven sun. My occupation is that of a laborer, but am infirm & have unable to labor last little. I have a wife named *Mary* aged 59 years who lives with her son in *Canandish* in the State. I have five children, three of whom are married, & one girl a cripple supported by *Charleston* N.H. in *New Hampshire* & one son, *David*, in the Army at the *Yellow Stone* ex-  
-pension.*
